

Javier Pérez often uses dissonant materials (silkworm cocoons and ceramics; cattle intestines and blown glass) to confront the viewer with death, mortality and impermanence. In his work *Carroña* (Carrion), black crows seem to be disembowelling a smashed, red chandelier. Pérez notes that he likes to transform ready-made objects so as to provoke multiple interpretations: 'Here there are two different levels of opposed meaning; luxury, brightness, this aspect that characterizes glass, Murano glass in particular, [here] transformed into something desolate.'

Marta Klonowska's *Large Kitchen Still Life after Michel de Bouillon* consists of a glass hare modelled after a similarly positioned hare in a traditional still-life painting by Michel de Bouillon, a seventeenth-century French painter. Klonowska often bases her delicate sculptures of wild animals and pets (mainly dogs) on those depicted in historical paintings; there the animal in question, dead or alive, was often included as a symbol of status and wealth. Klonowska's creatures are usually the same size as their counterparts in the source images.


